AUGUSTA-BASED DOCTOR RECEIVES COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARD

ATLANTA – Marshall A. Guill III, M.D., a dermatologist from Augusta, received the *Physician's Award for Community Service* for 2009 at the Medical Association of Georgia's (MAG) board of directors meeting in January.

In its nomination letter, the Richmond County Medical Society said that Dr. Guill "has served the Augusta-Richmond County community and the State of Georgia above and beyond the call of duty..."

As a medical student, he spent three months serving at a mission hospital in India. While serving in the Army in Hawaii, he took in a four-year-old boy whose father could not adequately care for him. He is an elder at Reid Memorial Presbyterian Church. He is a committee member of the Young Life of Greater Augusta organization, and he is a scout master for the Boy Scouts of America. Dr. Guill has provided youth in his community with housing, tuition, and transportation. And he has led youth mission trips to Ecuador, Ireland and Peru.

Dr. Guill provides voluntary medical services through the St. Vincent DePaul Clinic and the Richmond County Medical Society's Project Access program. He provides pre-participation physical exams for school sports, lectures at local high schools, and volunteers at the Soup Kitchen for the Homeless.

Dr. Guill has received community service awards from WJBF News Channel 6, the Exchange Club of Augusta, and the Medical College of Georgia.

Dr. Guill received his Bachelor of Science degree from Davidson College, and he is a graduate of the Medical College of Georgia. He received his post-doctoral training at Letterman Army Medical Center, where he also completed his dermatology residency. Dr. Guill was an assistant clinical professor and an associate clinical professor of dermatology at the Medical College of Georgia, and he has served in that department as a clinical professor since 2000. He is a member of the Association of Military Dermatologists, the Georgia Dermatology Society, the Augusta Dermatology Society, the American Society for Dermatologic Surgery, the Medical Association of Georgia, and the Richmond County Medical Society. He is a fellow of the American Academy of Dermatology. Dr. Guill has been published in journals more than 25 times, including the *Journal of the Medical Association of Georgia*.

Dr. Guill resides in Augusta with his wife, Margaret. They have two children.
